



UF HEALTH JOINS U.S. OLYMPIC & PARALYMPIC MEDICAL NETWORK

UF Health will become the third USOP National Medical Center and just the eighth system overall to become a health care provider for the U.S. Olympic & Paralympic Medical Network.

What is notable about UF Health joining the USOP Medical Network?

- ▶ UF Health is the **first member in the Southeast**, where many Team USA athletes live and train.
- ▶ To help ensure athletes' success, **UF Health will contribute significant** funds annually to the USOPC that will support athlete-centered programs.
- ▶ The initial agreement between the U.S. Olympic & Paralympic Committee and UF Health **is for two years**.
- ▶ UF Health was approached by the USOPC with this opportunity due to our **track record of delivering high-quality care, our commitment to research** and the comprehensive scope of services we are able to provide.
- ▶ In addition, part of UF Health's mission is to promote health through outstanding and high-quality patient care, which **aligns with the USOPC's mission** to empower Team USA athletes to achieve sustained competitive excellence and well-being.

What is the U.S. Olympic & Paralympic Medical Network and who is able to receive services?

Through a relationship with leading medical centers nationwide, the USOP Medical Network provides medical care to Team USA athletes, including access to an array of specialties, proven expertise and high-quality service.

- ▶ As a network member, **UF Health provides medical care to eligible Team USA athletes**, including orthopaedics, sports medicine, general medicine, women's health and more.
- ▶ Team USA athletes meeting the following criteria are eligible for services through the network:
 - ▶ Athletes enrolled, or eligible to enroll, in the USOPC Elite Athlete Health Insurance ("EAHI") program;
 - ▶ Athletes who sustain an injury at the Olympic or Paralympic Trials or any other event or competition organized, operated, sanctioned or formally authorized by the USOPC (collectively, a "USOPC-sanctioned event"); and
 - ▶ Athletes who sustain an injury at an event sanctioned by a national governing body ("NGB").
