

HEMORRHAGIC STROKE	ISCHEMIC STROKE
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Large volume intracerebral hematoma on CT ▶ Intracerebral hematoma with intraventricular extension ▶ Intracerebral hematoma with any midline shift of edema ▶ Intracerebral hematoma on anticoagulation ▶ Intracerebral hemorrhage involving the posterior fossa ▶ Concern for expanding hematoma ▶ Hunt & Hess Score greater than or equal to 3 ▶ Rapidly declining mental status, especially requiring intubation ▶ All SAH 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ NIHSS greater than or equal to 6 ▶ Signs and symptoms consistent with large vessel occlusion (“Drip and Ship”) ▶ Stroke in the young (less than 55 yo) ▶ CTA or MRA evidence of a large vessel occlusion ▶ Ischemic stroke involving greater than 1/3 of either hemisphere ▶ Ischemic stroke in the posterior fossa ▶ Ischemic stroke with evidence of midline shift or edema ▶ Hemorrhagic conversion of an ischemic stroke ▶ Declining mental status or a progression in symptoms
